

Curriculum, Instructions, and Pedagogy Articles (Sample)

Curriculum, Instructions, and Pedagogy articles should be structured in the following order: 1) abstract, 2) introduction, 3) curriculum and pedagogy method description, 4) analysis and critique, 5) discussion, and 6) recommendations. Word count should be no more **than 3,000 words**.

Title

Title of the Article

Abstract

A summary of the article including background, methods, results, and conclusions. (100-200 words)

Introduction

Introduction of the topic and the purpose of the study. (300-500 words)

Description of the curriculum, pedagogical methods, and education

A detailed description of the curriculum and teaching methods including those currently discussed in the paper. This should encompass how the review is conducted (i.e. its evaluation) and/or any applied methods employed. (250-500 words)

Analysis and critique

A summary of your analysis and critique of the curriculum or teaching method.

Aspects to be considered

Was it easy to implement? Does it align with current curriculum standards? How does it necessitate program redesign, teacher training, and specific materials, among other requirements? How does it affect student learning and/or teaching practices?

Discussion

A discussion of the key findings and their implications in educational context (s). (250-400 words)

Conclusions

A summary of findings and recommendations. (250-400 words)
