Book reviews should be structured in the following order: full citation details of the book, summary, critique, relevance to the area of practice and applicability to the Arab world or Qatar context; and Recommendation.

Book Details

- Each book review will start with the book citation using [APA style](#), edition, number of pages, the retail price of the book, and ISBN-13 or DOI.

Example 1-ISBN

Reviewer's Details

Evaluation /Critique of the book (300-400 words)

- What (if any) new information does the book present/provide and how might it affect the readers' practice?
- What evidence does the book present?

Relevance to the area of practice and applicability to the Arab world or Qatar context (300-400 words)

- Is the book as written applicable to the Arab world or Qatar context?
- Are there any ideas (i.e. cultural considerations, contextual considerations, etc.) that the authors have neglected to consider? What changes would need to be made for make it relevant to be implement the concept in the Arab world?

Recommendation (100 words)

- Would you suggest that educators or specialists read this book? Why or why not?
- Do you think this book can foster change or improve educational practice or policy?
