

Case Study (Sample)

Case studies should be structured in the following order: 1) abstract, 2) introduction, 3) case and context description (including stakeholders, scenario, and analysis provided if applicable), 4) discussion (including guiding questions, areas for considerations, pros/cons, and findings if applicable), and 5) conclusions (including recommendations and next steps). Word count should be no more **than 3,000 words**.

Title

Title of the Article

Abstract

A summary of the case including background, methods, results, and conclusions. (100-200 words)

Introduction

Introduction of the topic and the purpose of the study. This should include a description of the research problem (i.e. problem of practice), how it is commonly addressed, its significance, and how the study advances knowledge. (300-500 words)

Material and Methods

A detailed description of the procedures, participants, materials, and data collection methods, and analysis. (250-500 words)

Results

The interpretation of the results which includes relating them to existing literature and discusses their implications. (500-1,000 words)

Discussion

A discussion of the key findings, data, and/or observations and their implications in educational context (s). (250-400 words)

Conclusions

A summary of findings and recommendations. (250-400 words)
